**The UK is home to the world's largest and longest-running longitudinal studies. CLOSER aims to maximise their use, value and impact both at home and abroad. Bringing together nine leading studies, the British Library and the UK Data Service, CLOSER works to stimulate interdisciplinary research, develop shared resources, provide training,**

**and share expertise. In this way, CLOSER is helping to build the body of knowledge on how life in the UK is changing – both across generations and in comparison to the rest of the world.**

# Data harmonisation

**By analysing data from different studies, researchers can check the strength and accuracy of their results. This ultimately gives us a better understanding of how society is changing, and how policies have made a difference in people's lives.**


CLOSER is working to make data from longitudinal studies even more comparable, in order to encourage greater cross-cohort research. Data harmonisation involves recoding or modifying biomedical and socio-economic variables so they are similar across studies.



# Data linkage



**Government departments routinely collect data on various aspects of life in the UK, such as children's progress through the education system, information about benefits claimed and taxes paid, and individuals' experiences of hospital treatment.**



CLOSER is helping to link data from longitudinal studies to these administrative records, securely and with participant consent, so we can improve our understanding of how different aspects of people's lives relate to one another.



# Search platform

**CLOSER is building a search facility that will serve as a valuable tool for researchers to find variables across all nine cohort and longitudinal studies involved.**

The search platform will be designed for users with varying levels of experience in data management, data analysis and data discovery. It will provide relevant results for both basic and advanced queries.

# Research impact



**Researchers are increasingly encouraged to think about how their work benefits others – from the academic community, to the economy and wider society.**

CLOSER is working to maximise the impact of the studies on policy and practice. This involves supporting greater use of the data and findings, building bridges between sectors and disciplines, and promoting the value of the findings to policymakers and practitioners.





# Training and capacity building

The studies span

**CLOSER's training and capacity building programme is designed to help researchers develop the skills, tools and confidence to analyse complex longitudinal data sets. It also aims to share best practice across the studies.**

Events and resources include:

- training workshops on topics such as life course research and cohort study management
- customised longitudinal data sets for teaching on themes including health, social status and educational attainment
- tools to aid data harmonisation for experienced users.
