


CLOSER Discovery

search engine covering eight leading studies CLOSER Discovery is an online search engine that allows users to explore the content of eight UK longitudinal studies.

Discovery provides access to information at an unprecedented level of detail. As well as overviews of the studies and their data collection sweeps, users will be able to access detailed information about what, when and how information was collected from study members.

Data harmonisation

CLOSER's harmonisation projects include work on:

- body size and composition
- socioeconomic position
- biological sample analysis
- vision
- adult mental wellbeing
- overcrowding
- pubertal status
- biomarkers



Government routinely collects administrative data about individuals and their experiences across a wide range of areas, including education, benefits and health.

CLOSER is working with data controllers to encourage more linkage between longitudinal studies and administrative data, securely and with participant consent, to improve our understanding of how different aspects of people's lives relate to one another.

Research impact

Researchers are increasingly encouraged to think about how their work benefits others – from the academic community, to the economy and wider society.

CLOSER is working to maximise the impact of the studies on policy and practice. This involves supporting greater use of the data and findings, building networks between sectors and disciplines, and promoting the value of the findings to policymakers and practitioners.



Training and capacity building

The CLOSER studies span

80+ years CLOSER's training and capacity building programme is designed to share best practice across the studies, and help researchers develop the skills, tools and confidence to analyse complex longitudinal data sets.

Events and resources include:

- training workshops on topics such as life course research and longitudinal study management
- online resources for students and teaching staff, including material aimed at those new to longitudinal studies
- simplified data sets for analysis and teaching
- guidance to aid data harmonisation for experienced users
