Background to CSO

- The Central Statistics Office (CSO) is Ireland's National Statistical Office
- Our purpose is to collect, analyse and disseminate Statistics about Ireland's people, society and economy

Data Collection & Survey Design Before

- Previously subject matter experts in our Social Statistics sections had the responsibility of designing and creating questionnaires for their own statistical products
- Statisticians applied their own knowledge into the survey design and produced questionnaire specs for the IT Blaise team to develop



Data Collection & Survey Design Before Cont'd

- Disadvantages of designing surveys in this way;
 - Inconsistent Survey Design (no standard blocks of questions across different surveys for the same data)
 - Poor documentation across the Statistical process
 - Inconsistent survey specifications provided to Blaise
 - No final version of what went out onto the field



Data Collection & Survey Design Before Cont'd

- Historic questionnaires were stored across multiple Word documents & Blaise code formats.
- Implications arose such as;
 - Identify what questions we're used & worked previously
 - How to identify the linkage between questions cross multiple Surveys
 - Outputting Survey Specifications to field staff & data users
 - More time consuming to develop a survey
 - Error prone with no traceability, revisions or versions control



Our Motivation behind changing our Approach

- Our aims through utilising the DDI standard & Colectica products;
 - To develop a central repository for standard & reusable questions
 - Allow a platform for all involved in the process to review and discuss
 - Standardise content and improve metadata across all Social Surveys
 - Improve survey documentation & reporting
 - Reduce workload and burden for IT, QDU and relevant SME's

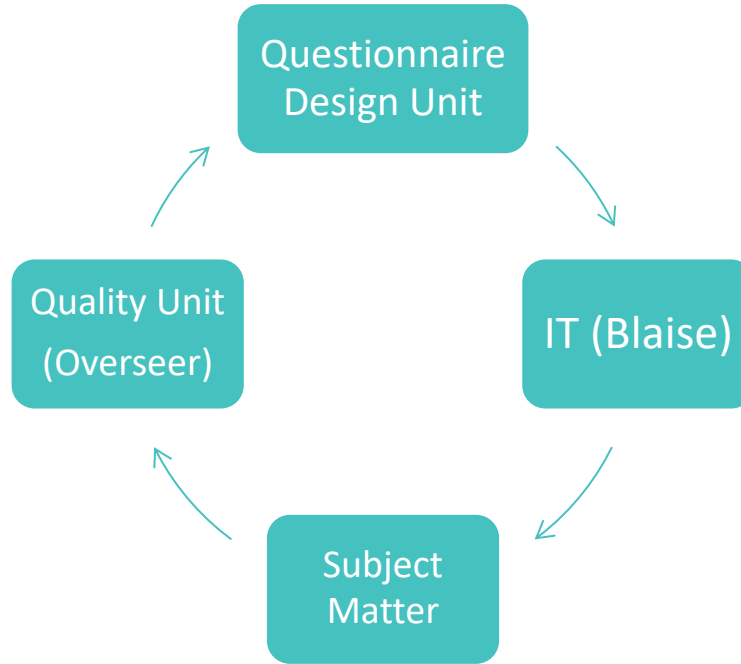

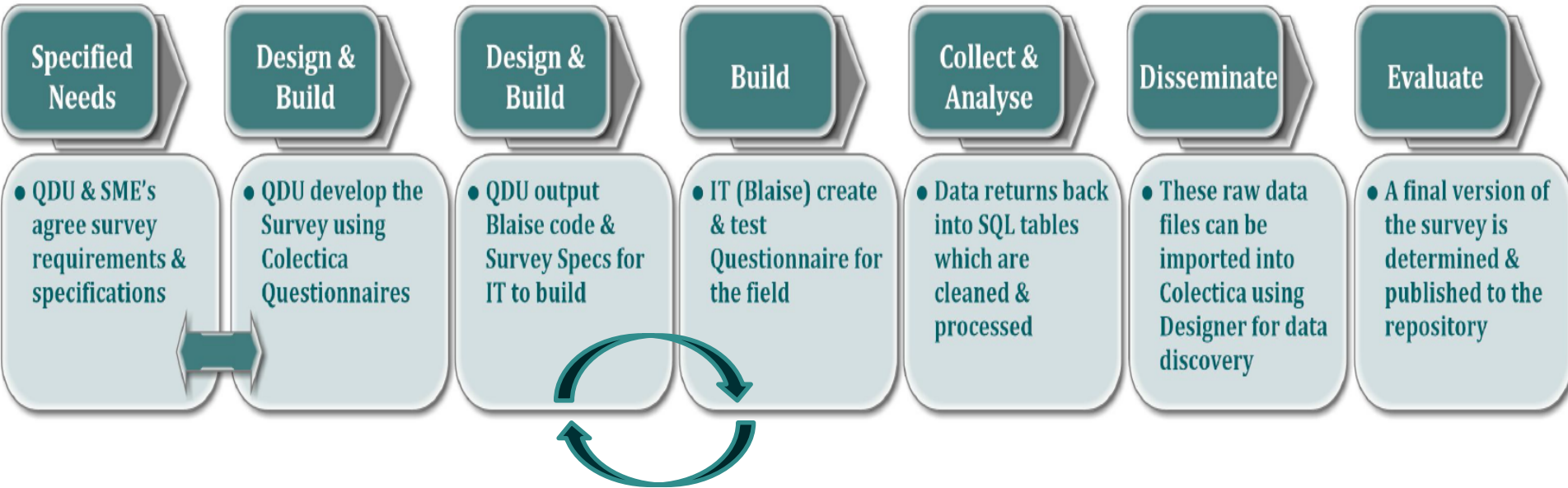

- Change in process results in a change of mind set
